ABOUT THE COURSE:

The social and emotional abilities (soft skills) are important for everyone. The course will provide an overview of the basic principles, evidence-based theories, and applications of soft skills. We will focus on soft skills topics which we need and use in personal life and at work.

Every lesson will consist four parts:

- 1) Reflection of why the basic theory is important
- 2) Introduction to the basic theory of a selected topic
- 3) Practising techniques of that topic
- 4) Implementing the theory in our lives

COURSE STRUCTURE:

The course will cover the following topics:

- 1. Introduction to Soft Skills, Individual/personal development plan
- 2. How do we learn (different preferences, mind maps etc.)?
- 3. Values, goals setting
- 4. Career planning, IKIGAI
- 5. Giving and receiving feedback
- 6. Non-violent communication
- 7. Stress management
- 8. Mindfulness and relaxation techniques
- 9. Positive psychology gratitude & loving-kindness meditation
- 10. Wrap up session, future goals

To complete the course:

- Attendance and active participation at the classes





- Final presentation of the topic students will prepare and present their chosen topic.
- Completing tasks given by the end of each lesson (as a follow-up).
- Write a short essay (2 A4 page) reflecting on the students' ability to apply discussed theories into everyday life
